Introduction

Clay tobacco pipes with the mark "the barrow man" are produced in Gouda, The Netherlands. There are no indications that this mark was also stamped on tobacco pipes in other production centres.

Gouda

The first owner of the mark the barrow man was a manufacturer with the last name De Vinck. It is not clear when De Vinck started with manufacturing of clay tobacco pipes. Probably he started in 1705.¹ It is for sure that he was the owner of this mark in 1725. After De Vinck died his widow inherited this mark. She was probably the owner until 1749. From 30 December² of that year Dirk Breukman was the new and last owner of this mark. Dirk has had it in his possession until 1756 the year he resigned from the pipe makers guild.³
